**With stormwater issues-** if they are within a city's limits, call the city.

Outside of city limits in Sonoma County is the jurisdiction of the North Coast Regional Water Quality Board, or you may also call PRMD.

**Stormwater incident types:**

Anything other than rain going to gutters and stormdrains ie: muddy water, sudsy water, water with paint or discoloration or other obvious pollutant. Any dry weather non-rain discharge like washing parking lots.

**NCRWQCB listing:**

Any discharge or action that causes a discharge of any pollutant to a waterway ie: muddy water from construction sites, contaminated or discolored water from industrial sites, equipment working in stream causing muddy water.
